

INJECTION HAZARD

Spray from the gun, hose leaks, or ruptured components can inject fluid into your body and cause an extremely serious injury, including the need for amputation. Splashing fluid in the eyes or on the skin can also cause a serious injury.

- Fluid injected into the skin might look like just a cut, but it is a serious injury. Get immediate medical attention.
- Do not point the spray gun at anyone or at any part of the body.
- Do not put hand or fingers over the spray tip.
- Do not stop or deflect fluid leaks with your hand, body, glove, or rag.
- Do not "blow back" fluid; this is not an air spray system.
- Always have the tip guard and the trigger guard on the spray gun when spraying.
- Be sure the gun trigger safety operates before spraying.
- Lock the gun trigger safety when you stop spraying.
- Check gun diffuser operation weekly.
- Follow the **Pressure Relief Procedure** on page 5 whenever you: are instructed to relieve pressure; stop spraying; clean, check, or service the equipment; and install or clean the spray tip.
- Tighten all the fluid connections before operating the equipment.
- Check the hoses, tubes, and couplings daily. Replace worn, damaged, or loose parts immediately.
 Permanently coupled hoses cannot be repaired; replace the entire hose.



TOXIC FLUID HAZARD

Hazardous fluids or toxic fumes can cause a serious injury or death if splashed in the eyes or on the skin, swallowed, or inhaled.

- Know the specific hazards of the fluid you are using. Read the fluid manufacturer's warnings.

FIRE AND EXPLOSION HAZARD



Improper grounding, poor air ventilation, open flames, or sparks can cause a hazardous condition and result in fire or explosion and serious injury.

- Provide fresh air ventilation to avoid the buildup of flammable fumes from solvent or the fluid being sprayed.

- Use fluids that are compatible with the equipment wetted parts. See the **Technical Data** section of all the equipment manuals. Read the fluid manufacturer's warnings.
- Route the hoses away from traffic areas, sharp edges, moving parts, and hot surfaces. Do not expose Graco hoses to temperatures above 82°C (180°F) or below –40°C (–40°F).
- Do not use the hoses to pull equipment.
- Wear hearing protection when operating this equipment.
- Comply with all applicable local, state, and national fire, electrical, and other safety regulations.

Installation

General



INJECTION HAZARD

Be sure your system has a bleed-type master air valve (pneumatic valves only) and a fluid drain valve. These two accessories help reduce the risk or serious injury, including fluid injection, splashing in the eyes or on the skin, or injury from moving parts if you are adjusting or repairing the pump or gun.

- The bleed-type master air valve relieves air trapped between this valve and the pump after the air regulator is shut off. Trapped air can cause the pump to cycle unexpectedly.
- The fluid drain valve assists in relieving fluid pressure in the displacement pump, hose, and gun; triggering the gun to relieve pressure may not be sufficient.
- 1. Connect a grounded fluid hose to the gun inlet.

- 2. With no tip installed, start the pump/sprayer. Flush it according to the instructions supplied with it. Prime the system with the fluid you are using.
- 3. Relieve the pressure.
- 4. With the gun safety latch engaged, unscrew the tip guard (25) and install the tip (B) and gasket (17) in the nut of the tip guard. Screw the assembly firmly onto the gun. Tighten with a wrench. See Fig. 1.



NOTE: Failure to install the tip gasket (17) will result in leaking.

5. Strain the fluid you are spraying if it contains particles which could clog the spray tip.

Grounding

To reduce the risk of static sparking, ground the pump, object being sprayed, and all other spray equipment used or located in the spray area. Check your local electrical code for detailed grounding instructions for your area and type of equipment. Be sure to ground all of this spray equipment.

- Pump or sprayer: as instructed in your separate pump or sprayer manual.
- Air compressor or hydraulic power supply: according to local code.
- Fluid hoses: use only grounded hoses with a maximum of 500 feet (150 m) combined hose length to ensure grounding continuity.
- Spray gun: obtain grounding through connection to a properly grounded fluid hose and sprayer or pump.
- Fluid supply container: according to local code.
- Object being sprayed: according to local code.
- All solvent pails used when flushing, according to local code. Use only metal pails, which are conductive. Do not place the pail on a non-conductive surface, such as paper or cardboard, which interrupts the grounding continuity.
- To maintain grounding continuity when flushing or relieving pressure, always hold a metal part of the gun firmly to the side of a metal pail, then trigger the gun.

Pressure Relief Procedure

A WARNING



INJECTION HAZARD

Fluid under high pressure can be injected through the skin and cause serious injury. To reduce the risk of an

injury from injection, splashing fluid, or moving parts, follow the **Pressure Relief Procedure** whenever you:

- are instructed to relieve the pressure,
- stop spraying,
- check or service any of the system equipment,
- or install or clean the spray tips.
- 1. Engage the spray gun safety latch.
- 2. Shut off the power supply to the pump and close any bleed-type master air valves in the air supply.
- 3. Disengage the gun safety latch.
- Hold a metal part of the gun firmly to the side of a grounded metal pail, and trigger the gun into the pail to relieve pressure.
- 5. Engage the spray gun safety latch.
- 6. Open the pump fluid drain valve (required in your system), having a container ready to catch the drainage.
- 7. Leave the drain valve open until you are ready to spray again.

If you suspect that the spray tip or hose is completely clogged, or that pressure has not been fully relieved after following the steps above, very slowly loosen the tip guard retaining nut or hose end coupling and relieve pressure gradually, then loosen completely. Now clear the tip or hose.

Using the Gun

INJECTION HAZARD

To avoid fluid injection from accidental spray, engage the gun safety latch. See Fig. 2.

- Start the pump. Adjust the fluid pressure so the spray is completely atomized. Always use the lowest pressure necessary to get the desired results. Higher pressure may not improve the spray pattern and will cause premature tip and pump wear.
- If adjusting the pressure does not give a good spray pattern, try another tip size. Be sure to relieve the pressure completely before changing tips.

 Use a full-open, full-close trigger action. Hold the gun about 350 mm (14 in.) from, and at right angles, to the work surface. Do not swing the gun in an arc. Practice to find the best length and speed of the stroke.



To reduce the risk of serious injury whenever you are instructed to relieve the pressure, always follow the **Pressure Relief Procedure** on page 5.

Adjust the Spray Pattern

- To adjust the spray pattern direction, relieve the pressure. Engage the safety latch and loosen the tip guard retaining nut. Turn the spray tip so the groove is horizontal for a horizontal spray pattern, and vertical for a vertical spray pattern. Tighten the retaining nut.
- The spray tip orifice size and spray angle determines the coverage and size of the pattern. When more coverage is needed, use a larger spray tip rather than increasing fluid pressure.

WARNING

INJECTION HAZARD

To reduce the risk of an injection injury, never use the gun with the tip guard or trigger guard removed.

A CAUTION

Openings in the tip guard are designed to reduce paint buildup on the guard while spraying. Any damage to the sharp edges of the openings causes paint to collect at that area. To reduce the risk of damage, never hang the gun by the tip guard.

Cleaning and Clearing the Spray Tip

▲ WARNING

INJECTION HAZARD

To reduce the risk of fluid injection or splashing in the eyes or on the skin, do not hold your hand, body, or a rag in front of the spray tip when cleaning or checking a clogged tip. Always point the gun toward the ground or into a waste container when checking to see if the spray tip is cleared. **Relieve the pressure** before wiping vbuildup off the gun or spray tip.

Clean off the front of the tip frequently during the day's operation and at the end of the work day. **Relieve the pressure**, then use a solvent soaked brush to clean the spray tip and to keep fluid buildup from drying and clogging the spray tip.

If the spray tip clogs while spraying, release the spray gun trigger, engage the trigger safety, shut off the pump, and **relieve the pressure**. Then remove the spray tip and blow out the obstruction with air from the front of the spray tip, or let the spray tip and gun nozzle soak long enough to dissolve the obstruction. If it won't dissolve, jar it out by tapping the back of the spray tip against a flat surface.

A CAUTION

Never soak the entire gun in solvent. Prolonged exposure to solvent can ruin the packings.

To reduce the risk of serious injury whenever you are instructed to relieve the pressure, always follow the **Pressure Relief Procedure** on page 5.

Flushing the Gun

WARNING

FIRE AND EXPLOSION HAZARD

Before flushing, be sure the entire system and flushing pails are properly grounded. Refer to **Grounding**, on page 5. **Relieve the pressure** and remove the spray tip from the gun. Always use the lowest possible fluid pressure, and maintain firm metal-to-metal contact between the gun and the pail during flushing to reduce the risk of a fluid injection injury, static sparking, and splashing.

Relieve the pressure, remove the spray tip, and then flush the gun and spray system with a compatible solvent. Always flush the gun before the fluid being sprayed can dry on it.



Troubleshooting

- If your gun leaks at the tip when you release the trigger, the needle or seat is worn or damaged and must be repaired. See Gun Packings on page 11.
- If the gun sprays with the trigger safety on, the needle travel must be adjusted. See Adjusting the Needle on page 11.

NOTES:

- A repair kit, Part No. 214–969, is available for repairing the gun. Use all new parts in the kit for the best results.
- Parts included in the kit are shown with a dagger, for example (24†), indicate that these parts are included in the repair kit.
- Periodically disassemble the gun to clean and inspect parts.

Needle

- 1. Relieve the pressure.
- 2. Screw out the spring retainer (19). Remove the spring (7) and needle (24). Unscrew the seat (23). See the Parts Drawing, page 12.
- Soak parts in clean solvent. Use the brushes supplied to clean the parts and gun body passageways. Replace worn or damaged parts.
- 4. If installing a new needle (24), remove the two nuts (20, 21) from the old needle, counting the number of turns needed to remove them. Screw the nuts onto the new needle the same number of turns and lock them together. Not that the thickest nut (21) goes on first.
- 5. Adjust the needle as instructed below before operating the gun.

Service

Adjusting the Needle

▲ WARNING


INJECTION HAZARD

Proper adjustment of the needle is essential to be sure the trigger safety latch makes the gun inoperative when engaged. Improper adjustment may result in serious injury, including fluid injection and splashing in the eyes or on the skin.

- 1. Tighten the seat (23) to 23 N•ym (200 in-lb).
- 2. Install the needle and spring in the gun and hold them in place with your thumb. See Fig. 4.
- 3. Check the travel of the trigger from the free position to when it stops against the safety latch (15). The travel should be about 8.1 mm (0.32 in.).
- 4. To adjust the travel, turn the two nuts (20 and 21) toward the front (clockwise) to increase travel, or toward the back to decrease travel.
- 5. Connect the hose.
- 6. Install the tip guard and prime the system.
- 7. Trigger the gun and release it. The fluid flow should stop immediately. Now engage the safety latch and try to trigger the gun. No fluid should flow. If the gun fails either test, relieve the pressure, disconnect the hose, and readjust the needle.

Gun Packings

- 1. Remove the trigger (14) and screws (1). See the Parts Drawing on page 12.
- 2. Remove the packing nuts (13) on both sides of the gun.
- 3. Remove the packings (10), glands (9† and 1) and camshaft (12).




- 4. Soak the new leather packings (10*) in oil until they are pliable, then install the packing, glands (9† and 11†) and camshaft (12).
- 5. Install the packing nuts (13) and tighten snugly.
- 6. Install the trigger (14) and screws (1). If the camshaft is too tight, loosen the spring retainer (19).
